Rezoning

Liz submitted an application to rezone the camp property July 28th. Plans to build a new cabin require this, because the current zoning (Rural Intermediate) doesn't allow for expansion beyond the footprint of existing buildings or for the addition of any new buildings. Now, we wait through several public hearings for the Skagit County Board of Commissioners to make a decision, likely by July 2018.
